Making Right Decisions

<u>Introduction:</u> Paul considers himself to be a great defender of the Gospel. These verses give us the determination that Paul had to remain committed to the Gospel until Judgment Day.

- I. Notice the term "the day of Jesus Christ" in verses 6 and 10
 - A. Paul is confident that the work of salvation begun by Christ will continue until Judgment Day. (6)
 - B. Paul is concerned that the church of Philippi grows more Christ-like until Judgment Day. (10)
 - 1. Their love needs to abound in knowledge.(9)
 - 2. Their love need to abound in "judgment" (discernment).
- II. Paul goes from knowledge and discernment to decision-making.
 - A. It takes love, knowledge and discernment to "approve things that are excellent. (10)
 - B. Our decisions both affect and reflect our minds and hearts.
 - 1. What we love and know and discern determines our choices in life.
 - 2. We need to be careful what we approve of in life; our hearts and minds will be affected.
- III. Why should our decisions be rational and spiritual?
 - A. There's an important day approaching all of us Judgment Day.
 - B. Christians should understand the seriousness of facing Jesus Christ.
 - C. There are two traits that believers need to have on Judgment Day.
 - 1. Sincerity There will be no pretense on Judgment Day.
 - 2. Innocence You don't want to face Jesus Christ with a life of bad decisions that were made irrationally and outside of God's will.

<u>Conclusion:</u> Godly decisions require knowledge and discernment. Be careful!!
