Text: I Corinthians 1:18-25

Title: The Power of the Cross

<u>Introduction</u>: The Gospel of Christ, particularly that part of the Gospel that refers to the cross, is considered foolishness by the world.

- I. <u>The Preaching of the cross has two primary effects:</u>
 - A. To the lost world it is "foolishness." (18)
 - 1. Why would Jesus die for me?
 - 2. Why would Jesus need to die for me?
 - 3. Why should I give my life to someone I don't know?
 - B. To he Saved it is "the power of God."
 - 1. Human life is transformed by the cross.
 - 2. The message of the Cross gives boldness.
 - 3. Human life is energized by the message of the cross.
- II. <u>Paul had to deal with two types of people.</u> (22)
 - A. The Jews wanted something they could see.
 - B. The Greeks wanted something intellectually stimulating.
- III. <u>The Gospel makes no sense to the world today.</u>
 - A. The world is SELFISH but the Gospel is SELFLESS.
 - B. The world sees everything that's important to them except Jesus.
 - C. The Gospel pits a man's life against the grain of life.

<u>Conclusion</u>: The Gospel is our spiritual nuclear weapon, and the cross is its warhead.
